Language that cares

Show you care by using 'language that cares' whenever you write about us.

When a young person is Gillick competent and able to access their file, they will see everything that you have written about them.

This could be many years after you wrote it, and there is no opportunity for them to go back and speak to you about it. All too often, the language used in children's files is cold, negative and impersonal.

Do you ever think how a young person will feel when they read what you have written? By taking a moment to think about the words you are using, you can show you care and make what can be a difficult experience, more positive.

Show you care, by using language that cares. We've put together some suggestions to help (see Gloucesterarry for additional words).


