## Strong Indicator that child may be / is being exploited

A child who is at increased risk of CSE / criminal exploitation and is likely to be/already being targeted for abuse through sex for affection, drugs, accommodation and goods etc

- 1) Follow usual procedures including referral to IRT who will lead the completion of a Risk Assessment (with multi-agency input)
- 2) A multi-agency meeting should be held to devise a safeguarding and support plan or such activity should be integrated into an existing multi-agency plan.
- 3) The plan should include actions in relation to disrupting, investigating and prosecuting perpetrators. Risk should be closely monitored and regularly assessed as part of the risk management process (this could be via MSET).

## **Social Care Threshold 4**

A child who is entrenched in sexual exploitation, criminal exploitation / county lines but often does not recognise or self denies the nature of their abuse often in denial, and where coercion/control is implicit.

## A multi-agency approach will be needed to promote child's safety and well-being: see **MSET Framework**

- 1) Follow safeguarding procedures including referral to IRT who will lead the completion of a Risk Assessment (with multi-agency input)
- 2) A multi-agency meeting should be held to devise a safeguarding and support plan or such activity should be integrated into an existing multi-agency plan.
- 3) The plan should include actions in relation to disrupting, investigating and prosecuting perpetrators. Risk should be closely monitored and regularly assessed as part of the risk management process (this could be via MSET)

Anyone who completes an exploitation screening tool, or is considering the need to do so, can seek advice from the Complex CIN team <a href="mailto:cwlccin&rrtteam@gateshead.gov.uk">cwlccin&rrtteam@gateshead.gov.uk</a>.

All cases that are screened at risk, significant risk, or serious risk should be referred to the IRT or discussed with the child's social worker if already known.

#### **National Referral Mechanism (NRM)**

The NRM is a framework for identifying and referring potential victims of modern slavery and ensuring they receive the appropriate support. Modern slavery is a complex crime and may involve multiple forms of exploitation. An individual could have been a victim of human trafficking and/or slavery, servitude and forced or compulsory labour.

Victims may not be aware that they are being trafficked or exploited, and may have consented to elements of their exploitation, or accepted their situation. If you think that modern slavery has taken place, the case should be referred to the NRM so that the relevant competent authority can fully consider the case. You do not need to be certain that someone is a victim – see: <u>The Referral Process</u>

Gι	idance for completing the screening tool:
	The purpose of the exploitation screening tool is to <i>support a professional judgement</i> about whether a child is at risk of/ being exploited and inform decision making about what action is required
	The screening tool supports in identifying where the behaviours / voice of the child may indicate they are being exploited, a more detailed multi-agency assessment and/or investigation may needs to be undertaken which may confirm this initial judgement, heighten or reduce concern.
	In some instances, the screening tool will identify that the child is no more vulnerable to exploitation than is typical for children of that age i.e. the risk is universal. This would be deemed to be "No Current Exploitation Risk".
	For any <i>Early Indicators of Exploitation</i> workers are encouraged to use the appropriate pathway for referrals and have discussions with relevant services (Child exploitation Social Worker/IRT) to determine appropriate action.
	Once a screening tool has been completed, usual referral pathways and thresholds need to be followed to ensure that where necessary a strategy meeting is convened and a risk assessment undertaken.
	Risk assessments should be led by a Social Worker, contributed to and supported by the professionals working with the child and family.
	The tool should be completed immediately by any worker who has a concern about a child or young person being exploited. A child is anyone under the age of 18.
	It is important that the screening tool is not completed in isolation as far as possible and that relevant people where possible are involved so that a complete picture of specific risks is ascertained. Children SHOULD NOT be asked to complete a screening tool.
	If <b>Strong Indicator</b> or <b>Exploited</b> is identified, a referral to IRT must be made unless the child is <i>already known</i> and in this case the worker who has identified the concerns should <i>notify the social worker</i> immediately. If this is a new referral then IRT will determine what course of action will be taken.
	It is helpful where possible to capture the voice of the child in the <i>evidence section</i> . There is no need for the child to be with you when completing the screening tool. The voice of the child is more than a spoken word and often behaviours / actions are the first sign something may be wrong. Evidence about your concerns should be captured as fully as possible, including any examples of the behaviour.
	Where you are aware of names of other young people, adults of concern, locations of concern please include them in the <i>evidence box</i> on the screening tool and complete and submit the intelligence form. These names should be passed also to IRT if the children are not known to social care for appropriate action to be taken.
	Guidance notes and risk indicators are not exhaustive PROFESSIONAL JUDGEMENT MUST BE USED
	The information inputted in this screening tool is sensitive and should be recorded, stored and shared as per information sharing guidance.
	Where possible consent should be sought from parents and carers to complete the screening tool and share the information unless to do so would place the child at increased risk. However refusal of consent should <b>not</b> prevent the tool from being completed and a referral to the IRT being made if there are concerns about <b>significant harm</b> to a child.
