How will you be involved?

We will seek your signed agreement before we start working with you and offering any support. This allows us to work more closely with others who may be able to support you. Your Family Support worker will come and meet your family; listen to the problems you are having individually and discuss how these are affecting you and your family as a whole. They will then assist you in putting together a family plan to enable you to achieve your goals, co-ordinating support with other agencies or organisations as required.

As the support comes to an end you may:

- feel more confident in parenting
- be living a more healthy lifestyle
- be back in employment or education
- be getting on better with your family and community
- find your children are attending more at school
- know where to gain support in the future

Family Support





Family life can be challenging for any parent, but when you are faced with lots of problems at once it can be hard to know where to turn.

Why are we doing this?

- to give every child the best start in life
- to build a strong family where parents are positive role models for their children
- so families can live free from parental conflict, domestic abuse and violence
- so parents of working age seek suitable training and employment and positively encourage their children to do the same
- to support families to take responsibility for their health needs
- so families in financial need are supported to make the necessary changes
- to improve the situation in your family to the point where you no longer need our help.



How does the service work?

Your family will be working with one Family Support worker who will work with the whole family for an agreed time period. They will provide you with practical hands on support with concerns such as school attendance, employment, access to health benefit and welfare services. They will call on relevant specialists to support you where needed.

Your Family Support worker will be open, honest and respectful towards you and your family and will provide support and challenge when required. They will be available for you to contact directly. They are there to support you to improve your skills to cope with life challenges.
