

## Family Hub Consultation Supplementary Paper 1 - Family Hub Local Needs Assessment Scores and Ranking

**This paper is supplementary information for the public consultation on Redcar & Cleveland Borough Council's Family Hubs.**

To inform the Family Hub Options Appraisal we have undertaken a Family Hubs Local Needs Assessment. This is necessary to meet the duty placed on local authorities at Section 2 of the Childcare Act 2006. The Act requires councils to consider the local needs of an area in its delivery of early childhood services.

There is a wide range of data available at a local level regarding topics such as child and maternal health, deprivation, poverty and involvement with children's services. Our local needs assessment brings together all this data (51 measures in total), to help build up a picture of each of the 24 electoral wards in Redcar & Cleveland and determine the level of need for Family Hub services.

The Family Hubs Local Needs Assessment ranks electoral wards from 1 – 24 (where 1 indicates highest need and 24 indicates lowest need), against each individual measure, it then adds up the scores against all the data measures to generate an average ranking against each category (the categories and data measures they contain are shown at table 1).

The scores from the 5 categories have then been added together to identify the wards which are most in need. The below table shows the scores for each electoral ward.


<b>Local Needs Category</b>	<b>Overview of Measures included</b>
<b>Economy</b>	Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) Score, Income Deprivation, Unemployment, Limiting Long Term Illness, Child Poverty, Childcare Eligibility, Fuel Poverty
<b>Child Development</b>	27-month questionnaire scores, EHCP Plans, School Readiness, Speech and Language Referrals.
<b>Health of Child</b>	New births, 0-4 population number and %, Breastfeeding, Childhood Obesity, Substance Misuse Among Young People, Dental Registrations.
<b>Health of Adult</b>	Perinatal Referrals, Health Visiting, Active Listening, Life Expectancy
<b>Social Needs</b>	Children Subject to Child Protection, Children in Our Care, Early Help Episodes, Domestic Abuse, Youth related ASB.

The table on the next page shows how each electoral ward was ranked within each of the five categories. By adding up the ranks we get the 'total rank score' which has then been sorted from lowest to highest to generate the Family Hubs Needs Assessment Ranking. This shows that Grangetown ward has the highest need and Belmont ward has the lowest need.
