



# Kinship Support Team

## **Post-18 Support**

April 2023 to March 2027





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#### Kinship Support Team – Post 18 support

The Kinship Care Support Team provide assessment of need and support services to Kinship Carers, who are caring for children within their family and friend's network, through a Special Guardianship Order, Child Arrangement Order, or no legal Order. This guide provides an overview of the support that is available to those nearing 18 years old and for post-18 support.

#### Signposting for Kinship Carers

A template letter\* is available for Kinship Carers requesting advice in preparation for the young person turning 18, which outlines support and services regarding the journey to independence post-18. **\*See Appendix 1** 

#### **Adoption Support Fund**

If the young person was previously in foster care, and therefore entitled to therapeutic support funded by the Adoption Support Fund (ASF), the team can make an application to ASF to be provided until the young person's 21<sup>st</sup> birthday, or 25<sup>th</sup> birthday if they have an ongoing Education and Health Care Plan (EHCP).

#### Letters of Support for Education

The team can provide support letters\* to Carers and young people to pass on to University and Colleges confirming the young person's kinship or previously 'in care' status, and supporting their need for bursaries and any other support available. \*See appendix 2





#### Additional Support and Services

#### **Care Leaver Eligibility**

If a young person has been previously 'looked after' for 13 weeks or more (after the age of 14/16) prior to granting of Special Guardianship Order (SGO), they may be eligible\* for support from the Care Leavers Team to be assessed for a 'leaving care package'. The young person can be allocated a personal advisor from 17 years old, to assist with their transition into independence, including CAMHS transition to Adult Mental Health Services. If care leavers are not entitled to free prescriptions, NHS Sussex (ICB) have agreed to provide an annual pre-payment card. **\*See appendix 3 for Care Leaver Eligibility Criteria**.

#### Adult Social Care

A referral to Adult Social Care can be submitted to undertake a Care Needs Assessment from 18 years old. A referral to the Transitions Team for a Panel meeting will be automatically sent if the child has a life-long disability/illness that will require ongoing support into adulthood; this referral can also be submitted if the child is likely to need extensive ongoing support in their adulthood.





#### Appendix 1 – template letter – Signposting

Use headed note paper

Dear Special Guardian

We note from our records that child's name is approaching 18 years old, and write to provide information and advice about services they may be eligible for, that may be beneficial for you now and in the future:

#### **Adoption Support Fund**

If the young person was previously in foster care, and therefore entitled to therapeutic support funded by the Adoption Support Fund (ASF), the Kinship Support Team can make an application to ASF to be provided until the young person's 21<sup>st</sup> birthday, or 25<sup>th</sup> birthday if they have an ongoing Education and Health Care Plan (EHCP).

#### Letters of Support for Education

#### Appendix 2 – template letter - Education

Use headed note paper

Dear Sir/Madam,

#### Re: Child's name college/university place

I am writing to you regarding child's name as they have been offered a place at college/university name, and I would like to provide you with some important information to ensure that child's name has a successful time within your educational setting.

<mark>Child's name</mark> is a \* **delete as appropriate</mark> previously 'Looked After Child' and/or\* living with a family member** under a Special Guardianship Order/ Kinship Care arrangement.

Due to their experience, child's name may have particular vulnerabilities or needs, and will benefit from any additional support that might be available during their time with you. Other information that may be helpful to share about child's name is add relevant information.

It is important that any bursaries or additional support should be made available to child's name, to ensure that they have a smooth transition into higher education. If a bursary is awarded to Child's name, he/she will be able to use the skills and knowledge that they have acquired to continue to achieve in their education, providing a good opportunity to help them reach their academic and career goals.

#### Appendix 3 – Care Leaver Eligibility Criteria

Care Leavers who meet criteria of Eligible, Relevant and Former Relevant below are entitled to support as follows:

#### Eligible Child

- Young person aged 16 and 17
- Young Person will have been looked after for at least 13 weeks since the age of 14
- Young person is still looked after

• Entitled to, a Personal Advisor, a Needs Assessment, a Pathway Plan, receive all the care and support they normally receive until they leave care

#### **Relevant Child**

- Young person aged 16 and 17
- Looked after by children's services for a period of 13 weeks since the age of 14
- Looked after for a period of time after their 16th birthday
- No longer looked after

• Entitled to: a Personal Advisor, a Needs Assessment, a Pathway Plan, Accommodation and maintenance financial support to meet education, training and employment needs

#### **Former Relevant Child**

- Aged between 18 and 21 or between 18 and 25 if still in full-time education
- Previously an eligible child and/or a relevant child

• Entitled to: a Personal Advisor, a Pathway Plan, kept under regular review, assistance with employment, education and training, assistance with accommodation, help with living costs

• Once a former relevant child becomes 21, they can choose whether to continue to have support and this can continue until they are 25.

#### Qualifying child

- Aged between 16 and 21 or between 16 and 25 if still in full-time education
- Looked after by children's services on, or after, their 16th birthday and no longer looked after
- Spent less than 13 weeks in care since 14th birthday, i.e. do not fulfil criteria for eligible or relevant child

• Entitled to, Advice and assistance from Leaving Care Service which may, be financial help with living expenses and if they are in higher education, they may also help with securing vacation accommodation. There is not an entitlement to a Pathway Plan or Personal Advisor

#### **Qualifying Child:**

Special Guardianship Order





- Young person age 18-25
- You were being looked after when a Special Guardianship Order was made

• Advice and assistance from Leaving Care Service which may, be financial help with living expenses and if they are in higher education, they may also help with securing vacation accommodation. There is not an entitlement to a Pathway Plan or Personal Advisor
