Where is there evidence of good practice and management of children and young people's Plans, the ISRO will complete a Practice Recognition Form. This format provides consistency about how and where information is recorded and stored as part of the child's electronic file record (LCS).

Completed Practice Recognitions will be shared with the social worker and their respective line manager (as evidence to support CPD) and the ISRO'S Team Manager.

Good practice will also be shared more widely across Children's Services which will support opportunities for wider learning.

Good practice may be characterised by exceptional efforts to achieve stated outcomes for a child or young person, and may include elements or all of the following:

Effective Interventions	Impact of intervention has achieved desired changes within the family
Effective planning and review	Documents are child-centred and child and young person friendly. They have clear and measurable outcomes and identify who is doing what and when. These will be reviewed by the ISRO at every Child in Care and Child Protection review.
Building a trusted and effective relationship	The core of good social worker practice, where the child/young person and their family is involved in decision making and planning. The practitioner has demonstrated and evidenced skill in building a good relationship with the child/young person and family.
A child-centred approach including attention to equality and diversity and uses language that cares	Practice has paid attention to a child or young person's individual needs and is responsive to factors relating to their age, ethnicity, identity, disability, language and culture for example
Multi-agency involvement	Effective communication and information sharing are key elements



	achieved by ensuring everybody is involved in the planning process for the child/young person to meet identified outcomes.
Management supervision and oversight of practice	The quality of practice and case recordings demonstrate strong management direction and sign-off. The plan for the child/young person is being discussed at every stage, there is evidence of the child/young person's participation and their wishes and feelings. Parents are kept informed and are central to decision-making wherever appropriate.
Quality of case recordings	Key documents and reports are recorded to a good standard. These show what is happening for the child/young person at any given time to enable an immediate understanding of what the child/young person needs, and clearly evidences their wishes and feelings. Information reflects and analyses need in order to develop and adjust children and young people's plans. Consistent case recording ensures accountability is maintained within the organisation
